The Pastor's Pen



As many of you are aware, I will soon be taking an eight-week ministerial sabbatical. From June 5th through July 30th I will be on a sabbatical leave from my responsibilities at St. Andrew. My time away will include some annual vacation time, but it will also include time for study, reflection, and continuing education.

The purpose of a sabbatical is to enhance the ministry of the congregation by giving the pastor an opportunity for personal and professional renewal and growth. According to the St. Andrew sabbatical policy, "A ministerial sabbatical is a time for a pastor to shift gears and seek activities to refresh and renew body, mind and spirit. It is not a vacation from church responsibilities. It is a time to deepen one's relation with God, self and family."

... I am grateful to the congregation ...

I was privileged to be able to take a sabbatical six years ago, and I am grateful to the congregation for granting me another opportunity for this kind of study and growth. I look forward to the ways in which

all of us, pastor and congregation, will benefit from this experience in our life together.

As I mentioned in my report for this year's annual meeting, part of my sabbatical will be spent exploring ways to strengthen and expand our congregation's stewardship ministry. Faithful stewardship is not only about managing our finances; it's about managing all of the resources God has entrusted to us – our time, our abilities, our relationships, the environment, and even the gospel itself. Being wise and effective stewards, both as individuals and as a congregation, is central to our vocation as people of faith.

With this year being the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation, I will also be preparing a Reformation-related sermon series to be delivered sometime this fall, as well as making other preparations for our congregation's observance of this significant anniversary.

While I am on my sabbatical, the congregation's pastoral needs will be met in a number of ways. Pastor Bob Hereth and other guest

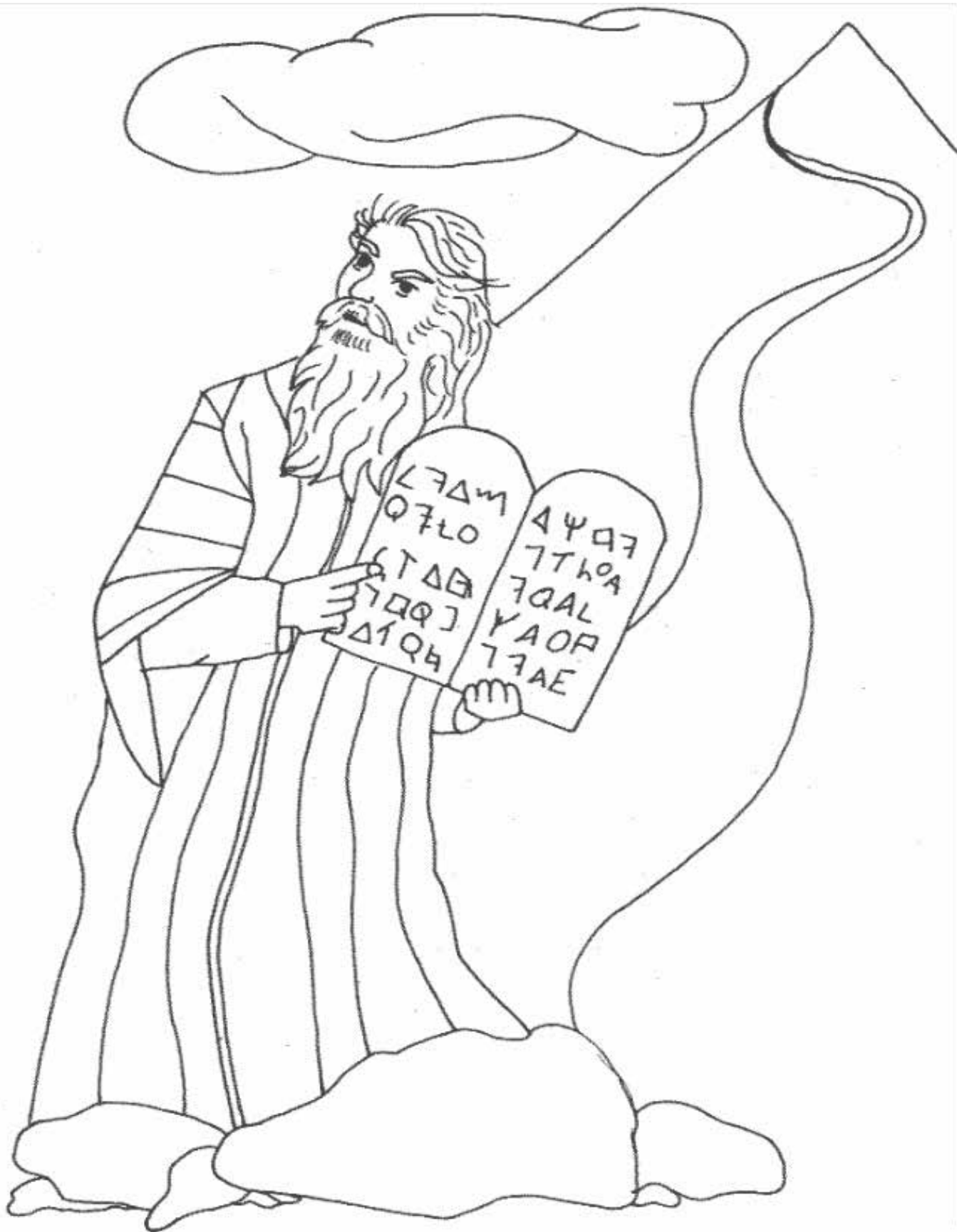
PRAYER VENTURES

- 21** Translators, missionaries and evangelists share the gospel in diverse languages and with respect for culture and context. We ask God to sustain their strength, wisdom and joy for ministry and teach us how to best support and encourage them in this challenging work.
- 22** We remember in our prayers the Caribbean Synod Assembly, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and excite their leaders and members for God’s work and witness in the world.
- 23** We pray the Spirit will guide, equip and inspire our church as we move forward in implementing and living into the directions, goals and priorities of ELCA Strategic Directions 2025, confident about who we are in Christ and what God is calling us to do in the years ahead.
