Beloveds, grace and peace to you in the name of Immanuel. Amen.

St. Andrew Family of Faith, a blessed new year to you all.

Early in 2020, I went to get my nails done with a few of my friends. The owner of the nail salon, a lovely woman named Linda, had written on her entryway blackboard: "2020 is going to be your best year yet". Anytime we reminded her of this sentiment throughout the year, she would exclaim, "Oh don't remind me of that!" in a rather chagrined tone.

While I know most of us want to put the old year behind us and embrace the new one—a group among which I am eagerly counting myself—I've been reflecting on my willingness to dismiss this dumpster fire of a year. I don't think this desire is an attempt to avoid the losses and grief and pain we have all encountered in the past calendar year, but rather a deep, deep desire to return to some semblance of normalcy. And what better way to do that than with some New Year's Resolutions?!?!?!?!

All around us we have messages of "new year, new you!", and the pressure for new years resolutions. We are told that who we are, on every level, can or should be improved. That somehow, who we are isn't enough. We aren't skinny enough, clear-skinned enough, eating all the right foods enough.

God, I would argue, does not appear to agree with the world's messaging. Surprising, I know—God disagreeing with the ways of the world. The miracle we just paid honor to as we remembered and celebrated the birth of Jesus is that bodies matter to God. Bodies matter to our loving Creator. Our physical selves are not an afterthought or something to be dismissed. By taking on human flesh in the form of Jesus, God tangibly showed us just how much matter matters.

This can be hard for those of us who on the best of days are apathetic about our bodies, and on the worst of days actively hate our bodies.

My own health struggles have often put me at odds with my own body, and the whole Body Positive movement can be really hard for me to embrace—although on an intellectual level I am 100% supportive of it.

Instead of setting New Year's Resolutions this year that revolve around weight loss, health routines that may or may not actually support our health, or making lists of "good" foods versus "bad" foods—which is a whole other topic for another day, but suffice it to say food is not an issue of morality, and we are not bad people for eating so-called "bad" foods—what would it look like for us to start out the year with our focus on God? The same God who chose to take on human flesh so that we could be reconciled to him? The same God who made his home among us?

Beloveds, our bodies matter. They matter to our community, and they matter to God. May this new year be a time for all of us to remember that we are created in the image of God, and that God's love for us meant taking on the fullness of humanity—wrinkles, fat, scars, and all.

Please remember that our payroll and utilities don't stop, so we still need your offering.

So, what can you do when you don't go out in public? It is called online giving and it will still allow you to make your offering. It is safe and secure with special protection so your identity cannot be stolen.

How do you do this? First, go to your computer and enter 'www. standrewmundelein.com'. It will open the Church's website and on the middle right-hand side is a section called 'Online Giving'.

The second step, if you have never done this before, is to create a 'profile'. This will be your Profile and you will use your email address and password to get in in the future.

To make a single donation, click on the Add Transaction button. Now you can enter the amount for Regular, Building, Benevolence, Youth, World Hunger or Chris Ed. Next enter a credit card, savings account or checking account and finish the transaction.

You can make it a one-time or recurring giving, and print a copy for your own records. That's how it is done. And don't forget to Log Off in the upper right corner.

This site is secure and works through Vanco Payment Soloutions (cs@vancopayments.com) theirs to do it and you don't have to share your login email address and password with them.

## STEWARDSHIP -

#### PROUDLY OUR WAY OF LIFE AT ST. ANDREW

God is and always will be with us – for this we continually must praise him and give thanks! One way to do this is to be faithful, to be brave and unafraid, to confess that we are children of God and to share our love with others. We are messengers of God's good news as John the Baptist was when he had the special assignment during another pivotal time in the world's history. He had a special purpose to announce Jesus' coming. Another way is to be a faithful and cheerful giver, to share what God has gracefully given to us while we are here on earth.

We just completed our Fall Stewardship Campaign and we were able to hear and think about our Money Story. We have only received about half of the pledge commitments so far than what we normally receive totaling around \$155,000. This number is far short of our annual operating budget and as the Finance Team and Council are trying to put together a budget for 2021, this poses a huge challenge. Last year the congregation approved an "unbalanced" budget but due in large part to some unexpected anonymous donations, we were able to keep in good financial standing. We cannot count on this again. Most pledges were kept up-to-date which the Finance Team said helped to keep us financially strong even though we also had a large expense that had to be paid to bring our boiler heating system up-to-date. OUR MOST SINCERE THANKS TO ALL! Please prayerfully consider how you each can support our ministries and the operations of OUR church. If you have not yet turned in a pledge, it is not too late but is possible, this should be done as soon as possible. Contact the church office with questions or if you do not have a pledge form.

Many good things have happened at St. Andrew, despite the pandemic and we want to continue our ministries to St. Andrew families and the community. And, as we are sure, all of us want to be able to get back together soon and be able to worship and work together face to face and side by side!

#### In 2020:

We searched for, found and called a new pastor!

We pre-recorded the service every Sunday for 23 weeks. Each week, this involved the gifts and talents of 7-9 people and over 40 hours of labor from all parties.

We gathered outdoors while the weather allowed us to do so, and began to celebrate the Eucharist each week. This practice has continued as we moved exclusively online.

Our church grounds were kept up with the help of some very awesome volunteers.

We began to gather virtually each week including worshiping live via Zoom, to the 14 kids in 8 households in KFC, to the 12 kids in 7 households in H2H, to now hosting regular weekly Bible study, coffee hour fellowship, and Advent midweek services. We hold Council, Worship & Music, St. Andrew Cares Safety Team, TST & Finance, Staff Support, and other team meetings via Zoom on a regular basis, committing our evenings and our energy to the business of the church. Our Women's Fellowship has begun to regularly gather again, via Zoom. The time has been edifying and encouraging.

Our H2H youth were able to gather as safely as possible for fellowship at Richardson's Farm and to pass out candy during the Mundelein Boo Bash (where we ran out of candy before we were even halfway through the Trunk or Treat time!).

We are staying connected with midweek Email Blasts with LOTS of good info. "Now thank we all our God with hearts and hands and voices; Who wondrous things has done, in whom the world rejoices. Who, from our mothers' arms, has blest us on our way. With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.".

- 1 Give thanks and praise that God knows intimately our complexities, failures, accomplishments, questions, goals and hopes, and still looks upon us with loving kindness, newness and a desire for us to thrive as individuals and communities.
- 2 Pray for our companion churches and international leaders as they confront multiple waves of the pandemic. Ask the Spirit to fill them with hope, resilience and reassurance that our faith in the presence and love of God, which we share as siblings in Christ, will unify us in caring for one another and in doing God's work in the world, using our diverse gifts, cultures, languages, resources and perspectives in every circumstance.
- 3 Give thanks and praise to God that we are children of God, knowing and testifying to the good news that Jesus Christ became flesh and lived among us, and that we have seen the glory of God's only son, full of grace and truth for the world.
- National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month We remember and pray for victims of sex trafficking, involuntary servitude, debt bondage and forced labor in our nation and around the world, and we ask God's guidance in caring for victims and actively working to end this abuse, injustice and oppression.
- 5 Pray for Bishop Elizabeth A. Eaton, members of the ELCA Church Council and the Conference of Bishops. Give thanks for their humble service, their faith in Christ, their leadership and gifts, and their commitment to wrestle with difficult decisions and issues for the sake of the church and the world.
- **6** Epiphany As people of faith, we are not immune from wondering about God, Jesus Christ and the Spirit. Pray that God will be patient with us, illuminating the truth of who we are as baptized children of God and the reality and certainty of the good news of Jesus Christ, the true Son of God, our Savior, Messiah, Redeemer and teacher.
- As the pandemic continues, pray for doctors, nurses, emergency responders and health care workers who need renewal, strength and our gratitude and recognition as they continue to serve at great personal

- risk and sacrifice for the sake of our health and wellbeing.
- **8** Give thanks for the people in our lives who inspire hope, faith and courage, and whose words and actions touch us, teach us the meaning of grace and move us to become bearers of mercy in the world.
- In Christ we have received forgiveness of our sins and salvation through God's unfathomable grace, showered upon us every day. Praise God!
- 10 Give thanks for God's love and forgiveness in baptism, which marks the beginning of our journey with our siblings in Christ to share the good news, serve all people, grow the church and strive for peace and justice in the world.
- Pray for parents, students, employees and business owners whose plans and routines change day by day and week by week due to the uncertainty of the pandemic, that they might be hopeful, resilient and able to adapt, change and endure.
- 12 Pray for our faith-based schools, early childhood education programs and day care centers as they provide experiential education, social interaction, stability and calm for the youngest of our children, who are often most vulnerable during times of uncertainty and anxiety.
- 13 God is mighty, majestic and eternal throughout the universe, generously sharing strength and blessings with us. Give glory and thanks to God, and shout for joy!
- 14 Ask God to help us practice justice, generosity and care for creation, sharing our resources with others who have few or who have lost resources or productive land as a result of natural and human-caused disasters.
- 15 Pray for the young adults who have applied for a yearlong journey in international service with our companion churches and organizations through the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) program, which will resume in 2021-2022 after a time of sabbath during the pandemic.
- 16 Thank God for our special relationship with the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), a full communion partner with the ELCA since 1997; pray for the church, its members and its leaders, and pray that together we will find strength and new resources for the work of

- sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor, especially in these uncertain and challenging times.
- 17 Jesus invited Philip to follow him as a disciple, and Philip, in turn, invited Nathanael. Ask God to help us be faithful followers, students and, at the same time, disciples eager to invite others to join in God's good work in the world.
- 18 Martin Luther King Day Today we remember the life, ministry, sacrifice and activism of Martin Luther King Jr. Pray that his life and the legacies of others who have fought for civil rights and social reform will inspire our own commitment and persistence in working for racial justice, dismantling racism and combating white supremacy.
- We may argue about what is legal, what we are entitled to or what we have the right to do with our bodies and lives. But Paul reminds us that we have been made one with the body and spirit of Christ; we "were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body." Pray that the Spirit will guide us to live with humility and deference for who we are in Christ and in obedience to the ways and desires of God.
- 20 Inauguration Day As members of society and the church who represent varied political affiliations and perspectives, pray together for our nation's newly elected president and vice president, that the Spirit will grant them wisdom, strength, commitment to serving all people, a deep understanding of justice and mercy, and the courage to enact change for the well-being of our communities and nation.
- 21 Pray for the ELCA World Hunger Leadership Gathering, an online event happening right now that gathers ELCA World Hunger leaders for learning, networking, sharing ideas and planning for our common ministry to address hunger and its root causes.
- Pray for reconciliation, understanding and renewal in our divided nation so that we might work together for justice, compassion and generosity, serving our neighbors in need and the well-being of our communities as they struggle with vexing, deep-rooted problems. Ask the Spirit to inspire and guide our lives so that our values, decisions, actions and words reflect the gospel, the teachings of Jesus and the ways of God, who is good, gracious, merciful and just.
- 23 Praise God that, as small and insignificant as we might be in the vast universe, we are wonderfully

- made and God knows every little thing about us and our human ways.
- In Scripture we read about Jesus' simple, personal and compelling invitations to Simon, Andrew, James, John and the other disciples to drop everything and follow him. Pray that when God calls us to follow and serve, we will respond with faith and trust, even if we do not yet know where God is leading us or what God is calling us to do.
- 25 Pray for ministries, nonprofit organizations and agencies that serve the daily needs of communities, families and individuals; pursue justice and equity; build resilience to cope with disasters and crises; accompany immigrants and refugees; and bring the hope and love of Christ where there is despair and weariness.
- 26 When, like Jonah, we are reluctant to forgive, practice mercy or share the gospel with those we deem undeserving, ask the Spirit to help us discern God's ways, grace and mercy for all people, and to act boldly without personal bias.
- 27 Lydia, Dorcas and Phoebe, witnesses to the faith
  Praise God for the witness and ministry of women
  of the early church. Give thanks for women of all
  ages and backgrounds who, responding to God's call,
  continue to use their gifts, life experiences, knowledge
  and passions to grow the church, serve all people and
  be bearers of hope and healing in the world.
- 28 Give thanks for the Lutheran liturgy and worship practices that equip us for daily life, helping us to praise God, listen to God's word and experience unity in the body of Christ.
- 29 Give thanks for the self-sacrificing generosity of people who demonstrate their gratefulness for God's gift of life and their concern for their neighbors' well-being by donating blood, plasma and even organs.
- 30 Remember in prayer those who continue to struggle with unemployment, underemployment and job searching as a result of the economic and health impacts of COVID-19.
- 31 Though our creeds do not speak of Jesus' teachings, miracles or example, give thanks that, through Scripture, the Spirit reveals Jesus to be the source of our redemption and a trustworthy guide, instructing us how to live with one another, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world today.


