Dear St. Andrew Family of Faith, As we enter the sacred season of Lent, we do so with the theme of "Cultivating and Letting Go." The word cultivate means, "to foster the growth of" or, "to improve by



labor, care, or study." It is a word of action, calling us to nurture what is life-giving while also recognizing when it is time to release what no longer serves us. Lent is a season of spiritual gardening-of inviting God to unearth in us what lies fallow, what needs tending, and what must die for new life to emerge. WE ARE "TOGETHER FOR JOY" TO LOVE AND SERVE ONE ANOTHER

We have heard over and over again from the readings and Pastor Jenna's sermons that we are called to LOVE AND TO PUT THAT LOVE INTO ACTION! No one gets special treatment. Love is already given to us; it is up to us to put that love into action! In this world today, it is sometimes, maybe many times, difficult to choose patience and kindness; not to let distractions and the "clangy gongs" get in the way. Sometimes we must forgive those who have sinned against us; we must do the things Jesus wants us to do. Our mission is to follow Christ and to be the "body of Christ". This must be done to fulfill God's promise to us. God sent his son, Jesus, to be our teacher and to show us the way to live. We also must remember that we are ALL members of this body and without any one of us, the body cannot function as a whole. "Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many." 1 Corinthians 5:14.

I know that all of our lives are busy and we may not feel that we are significant or that we have too much to do or that we cannot fit another thing into our busy schedules. Myself, with children grown and out of the household and, unfortunately, no children or grandchildren close around that take up my time, I still feel overwhelmed at times even working just part time. And with only two people in the household, things don't even get that messy to take up all my time trying to keep the house tidy (or at least somewhat tidy)! For a long, long time, I

have been a "list maker" to try to keep myself on track or somewhat organized. Although, at the end of some weeks, there are usually at least several things that keep getting "pushed ahead". There are some of you who can still probably keep that list "in your head" or keep it on your phone or tablet. The story below, struck me, being a "list maker" myself; I thought I would share it with you. It may be significant to our "conversation", or not..... written by Debbie Mc-Comber and published in 2025 "Walking in Grace" devotional:

"I'm a list writer. Lists help me feel like I'm more organized than I actually am. They help me to maintain my focus and keep me on track. And when I've crossed off one of my goals, it gives me a feeling of accomplishment. For more years than I can remember, every Monday morning, I list five things I hope to accomplish that week. Μv goals for the week aren't pie-inthe-sky ideas - they are simple goals to keep me on track. The first four are almost always the same: 1. Make progress on my current writing project. 2. Bible study. 3. Progress on my current knitting project. 4. What I call "extra reading" - a chapter in a book that inspires my walk with the Lord, or the current book club choice. The fifth one is the one that varies from week to week. One week it might be a decluttering project or encouraging notes of appreciation to those who have touched my life - whatever the Lord puts in my mind.

I keep track each day, writing down what I did to fulfill that goal. At the end of the week, if I followed through and made progress on my list, I give myself a big red star. Success!

It seems the Lord keeps lists Himself. The Ten Commandments are one example, but He doesn't stop there. His lists continue all through Scripture: The Beatitudes (Matthew 5: 3-12); the building blocks of faith (2 Peter 1:5-7); and the fruit of the Spirit, the attributes of a mature Christian (Galatians 5:22-25).

List, lists and more lists. It's fun to search through Scripture and take note of the lists God has. Now 'those' are lists worth noting."

Debbie's list "procedure" seems way more organized and sophisticated than mine (oh, if only you would see my lists?!).... Whether you are a list maker or someone who can just forge ahead or "go with the flow", may you find time and find it in your heart today and all davs, to answer the call when you hear, ".....the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us" And I said, "Here am I; send me!" (Isaiah 6: 8). Thank you to all "members" who are a part of the "body" of St. Andrew!

Lord, I offer my time. In your hands, may it be used to care for others. Amen.

)uilters' Crossing

"...... truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." Matthew 25:40

Your St. Andrew quilters continue to do our work each Thursday morning from 9-12 -matching fabric, cutting, putting tops and bottoms together and then tying it all together!

We have again WELCOMED another new person to our "fold", Maggie who saw the sign, called the church and then joined us and jumped right in!

We continue to pray not only for those who our quilts help to warm, but our own members who have been dealing with some challenges of their own. We pray for continued strength and healing for Barb and Chris and any others not named here but who may also need extra prayers for things going on in their lives. We are truly sisters of faith and caring for each other!

It is always nice to be able to find out where some of our quilts end up. The Port of Baltimore is the starting point for most shipments of Lutheran World Relief quilts and Care Kits. From there, seafarers from all over the world transport them across the seas to ports in Africa, Asia, Latin America and beyond. But last spring, for the first time in LWR history, the ships themselves were the final destinations-and the seafarers were the intended recipients.

On March 26, 2024 the cargo ship, Dali, crashed into the Francis Scott Bridge - located just a few miles from LWR headquarters in Baltimore, MD. The bridge collapsed, tragically killing six construction workers and trapping 10 other ships and their crews in port for several weeks after the crash. Because they originally did not intend to stay in Baltimore more than a day or two, multiple crews did not have visas that would allow them to leave their ships. LWR depends on the hard work and sacrifice of seafarers like these to carry our love around the world. When dozens were stuck on ships in our backyard, LWR knew they had to help to make them more comfortable.

In total more than 150 quilts and personal care kits were distributed across seven ships. One recipient, Hu Xin Peng, couldn't wait to get back home to China later in the summer to wrap his infant son in his "new quilt". With the help of Rev. Messick, a chaplain and the executive director of the Baltimore International Seafarers Center, who reached out to LWR, they were able to make the seafarers lives a bit more comfortable as they were stuck away from home and their families much longer than they had intended!

We are so grateful that our work DOES MATTER! We continue to thank all who continue to support our ministry by donating fabric, good used sheets and also for financially supporting us! PRAYER VENTURES March 2025

These petitions are offered as guides to prayer for the global, social and outreach ministries of the church. Thank you for your continued prayers for the life and mission of this church.

- 1 Remember in your prayers the members of the 1 Give thanks for God's compassion, forgiveness and concern for humanity, which extend far beyond rules, borders, ideologies and bias. Pray that we are inspired to do likewise!
- 2 Thank God for the example of Jesus Christ, focusing not on his crucifixion but on what God reveals to us through his journey of life, suffering, death and resurrection.
- 3 Pray for lasting and resilient peace in the Holy Land and Middle East, that those who have suffered and lost much will experience justice, hope and healing as they rebuild their lives and communities.
- 4 Praise God for young people who serve our neighbors through ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM), working alongside global companion churches and organizations. Pray that their yearlong journeys will be blessings to the communities they serve and will strengthen their faith, clarity of vocation and understanding of people in diverse contexts.
- 5 Ash Wednesday Pray that we will wear the mark of the cross on our foreheads with humility and repentance and will remember why we are baptized into Christ: to proclaim the gospel, bear love and mercy into the world, serve our neighbors, strive for justice, grow in faith and glorify God in all we do and say.
- 6 Ask the Spirit to guide us through the season of Lent, that it might strengthen our faith in God's sacrificial love through Jesus Christ. Give thanks for the knowledge that we live in God's all-encompassing grace, given despite our weakness, uncertainty and arrogance.

- 7 Lift up praise and thanksgiving that God is perfect, impartial and ever present, defending those who suffer.
- 8 Remember in prayer our national leaders, that they will exercise wisdom, compassion, justice, mercy, respect for the diversity of humankind and attentiveness to those who are neglected and excluded. Pray that our leaders will foster well-being in our communities, nation and world.
- 9 Pray that the Spirit will give us strength whenever we are tempted to stray from the ways of God, revealed to us in human terms through the life of Jesus Christ.
- 10 Give thanks for moments of joy and celebration in your life and the lives of your neighbors and siblings in Christ.
- 11 Who is our neighbor? Pray that we might recognize people everywhere in the world as our neighbors, created by and beloved of God and sharing with us a common lineage.
- 12 Ask God to bless our congregations' community meals during Lent, that we might build relationships, reflect in prayer and feel renewed in our enthusiasm for doing God's work in the world.
- 13 "When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble; I will rescue them and honor them" (Psalm 91:15). Lift up prayers of gratitude to God, who hears our pleading and lamentations and does not ignore or abandon us.
- 14 Give thanks for the ELCA Fund for Leaders scholarship program, which supports students attending ELCA seminaries so that they can graduate with less debt and respond to God's call as the church needs and the Spirit leads.
- 15 Pray for the ELCA AMMPARO Migrant Ministry, ELCA Witness in Society, ELCA World Hunger, Global Refuge, Lutheran Services in America and other partner ministries and organizations that uphold basic human rights, address causes of migration and help immigrants, asylum-seekers and refugees rebuild

their lives in our country.

- 16 "O God, you know all that we think or do, you know the pain we put each other through. Lord, have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord, grant us peace" (WOV 739). Praise God for the boundless love and forgiveness that create a new spirit within us and enable us to change how we behave toward our neighbors.
- 17 Remember in prayer the 240 ELCA missionaries who serve alongside global church partners in more than 40 countries, doing God's work in the world and supporting the growth of new congregations, urban and youth outreach, theological education, pursuit of justice and peace, and leadership training.
- 18 Remember in prayer congregations that are working through leadership transitions, assessing their missions and resources, and searching for pastors, deacons or others to become teachers and leaders.
- 19 "The Bible is alive, it speaks to me; it has feet, it runs after me; it has hands, it lays hold of me" (Martin Luther, Table Talk). Pray that the word of God in Scripture will lay hold of us and reveal something new to us each time we read the Bible, hear it read aloud or reflect on its implications for our daily lives.
- 20 First Day of Spring Sing praises and lift up prayers of joy and thanksgiving for the new life, light and hope that emerge with spring — awesome gifts from God, the Creator.
- 21 Thank God for the ELCA's special relationship with The Episcopal Church, a full communion partner since 1999. Pray for the church, its members and its leaders, that together we will find strength and resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.
- 23 Water is a gift from God and a vital resource that sustains all living things. Pray for wisdom and discipline that we might preserve, manage and restore water resources essential to food production and life itself for people around the world.
- 23 Let us repent our sins to God, just as we

are, asking God's forgiveness, guidance and transformation.

- 24 Pray that our Lenten reflections and conversations will lead us to a clearer sense of our identity, our mission and our calling to proclaim the life-changing gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 25 Give thanks for godparents and baptismal sponsors who encourage our faith, teaching us to live as children of God and followers of Christ throughout our baptismal journeys.
- 26 "O God, you are my God; I seek you; my soul thirsts for you" (Psalm 63:1). Reflect on the longings of your soul and give thanks that the Spirit moves with us through Lent, leading us to the foot of the cross.
- 27 Give thanks for ELCA Ministries of Diverse Cultures and Communities, which works with ELCA congregations, synods, agencies and institutions to make the church more culturally diverse, anti-racist and inclusive of all God's children.
- 28 God's pardon of our human shortcomings and sin can never be earned or bought. Pray that, forgiven and freed in Jesus Christ, we will respond with gratitude, compassion and mercy for others.
- 29 Give thanks for the Evangelical Lutheran Education Association (ELEA), which supports, equips and encourages Lutheran educators, and for our congregations' faith-based day care centers and preschools, which provide safe and nurturing environments for faith formation.
- 30 Hallelujah! God's loving embrace surpasses our wildest hopes, restoring us as God's children through the life, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
- 31 Ask the Spirit to equip, inspire and guide us as ambassadors of Christ in the world, children of God who love our neighbors in need and share the good news with everyone.


