Dear Friends in Christ,

Spring is here! Easter is coming soon! Summer is coming soon! We rejoice at this time of year for all the longed-for times that are arriving. At this time of year we have hope for what is to come!

Easter is the centerpiece of the Christian year and the Christian life. Only by Jesus defeating the power of sin and death are we worthy of God's victory of love at Easter. It is a wonderful time of year, both for its powerful significance for Christians – as well as the rebirth of nature here in the northern hemisphere. I get so excited when I think of seeds being planted, seedlings being transplanted into the garden, and everything sprouting, greening, and growing. It's been a long winter (albeit a mild one,) and I'm ready for the fullness of the warm season.

People of faith long for Easter, the joyous celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. Without the observing of Maundy Thursday (Holy Thursday) when Jesus teaches his disciples to love one another – by washing their feet, and Good Friday when we participate in the telling of Jesus' suffering, the celebration of Easter can be deprived of its deep, true meaning.

So, what can you do when you don't go out in public? Well, there is a way to give without coming to Church. It is called online giving and it will still allow you to make your offering. It is safe and secure with special protection so your identity cannot be stolen.

How do you do this? First, go to your computer and enter '<u>www.</u> <u>standrewmundelein.com</u>'. It will open the Church's website and on the middle right-hand side is a section called 'Online Giving'.

The second step, if you have never done this before, is to create a 'profile'. You will enter your email address, twice to make sure you did it the same, then First Name, Last Name, Address, City, State, Zip code and then a Password twice. This will be your Profile and you will use your email address and password to get in in the future.

To make a single donation, click on the <u>Add Transaction button</u>. Now you can enter the amount for Regular, Building, Benevolence, Youth, World Hunger or Chris Ed. Next enter a credit card, savings account or checking account and finish the transaction.

You can make it a one-time or recurring giving, and print a copy for your own records. That's how it is done. And don't forget to Log Off in the upper right corner.

This site is secure and works through Vanco Payment Soloutions (cs@ vancopayments.com) theirs to do it and you don't have to share your login email address and password with them.

PADS NEWS

This is the 10th year St. Andrew is serving at the Messiah Lutheran PADS shelter site which operates weekly from October through April. <u>Unfortunatly the Messiah PADS shelter site needed to be closed</u> and PADS Lake County is scrambling to accommodate homeless in face of coronavirus-related issues.

Lake County's largest provider of homeless services has lost three of its 15 overnight shelters, and is on the brink of losing three more, as the organization struggles to follow government guidelines to prevent the spread of the novel coronavirus yet maintain its vital support for one of the county's most vulnerable populations.

The restrictions handed down by Gov. J.B. Pritzker have intensified since Lake County reported its first case on March 11, and the numbers locally and statewide have climbed. Homeless shelters have been among the locations specifically identified as being exempted from the closures that Pritzker has ordered. "As long as the word 'homeless' came out of his mouth, I am happy," said Meghan Powell-Filler, PADS Lake County's executive director.

Still, PADS Lake County, with 28 employees and more than 3,000 volunteers throughout the year, is a case study of the difficulties faced during the viral pandemic by organizations giving support to persons experiencing homelessness, who are at high risk of COVID-19's effects due to a variety of factors including unresolved health problems.

Powell-Filler's organization is facing the challenging reality that its clients have no home to stay at, and must find a way to work social distancing and restrictions on mass gathering into a system that relies on the community of its clients and close-knit work of volunteers.

"I feel a little like we're on an island by ourselves," Powell-Filler said. "We're following the recommendations as much as we can, but our [volunteers] are also trying to follow the recommendations."

Recently, Warren Township Supervisor Suzanne Simpson allowed use of one of the township's gymnasiums, which PADS has started staffing around the clock as a way to make up for the churches that are dropping their overnight sheltering services.

"Most of the places that our clients usually go to during the day – the libraries, the restaurants – they're closed now," Powell-Filler said. "That's why, if we close, they will have nowhere to go." Powell-Filler said the group could use more volunteers, as many current volunteers are in a higher-risk age group to COVID-19.

"We just need them -- College kids who are home now, who might not be an at-risk group, maybe people who didn't think that they could volunteer before," she said.

PRAYER VENTURES March 2020

- **1** Give thanks for laughter, smiles, joy and humor today! Praise God for humor that lifts our spirits and provides us an unexpected doorway to reflect on social issues that are difficult to ponder or discuss.
- 2 Pray for God's blessings upon the ELCA's Arab and Middle Eastern Ministries, which serve our neighbors and strengthen the church through evangelical outreach, advocacy, social ministry, ecumenical and interfaith relations, leadership development and affirming the dignity and worth of Arab and Middle Eastern people and their cultures.

3 The season of Lent can seem dark, muted and immersed in thoughts of our human weaknesses and failings. But along the way, remember to give thanks for the good news and hope found in our journey to the cross and in the life-giving miracle of Jesus' resurrection.

Give thanks for bishops, staff, volunteers and leaders who serve in our synods across the country. Pray that the Spirit will strengthen and encourage them for service in the diverse contexts to which God has called them.

5 Palm Sunday Some people describe our times as post-Christian, an era in which Christ has little meaning, influence or relevance. 7 Pray that we will be guided by the spirit, manner and example of Jesus to be humble and gracious in our faith, service and lives.

8 *Total Inclusion!* Widening the Welcome at ELCA Outdoor Ministries is a collaboration between the ELCA churchwide organization and Lutheran Outdoor Ministries, the association of camps and retreat centers affiliated with the ELCA. Pray

that this new program will equip and empower outdoor ministry organizations and leaders as they move toward more intentional welcome of people who historically have been marginalized in the church and society - especially people of color, people with disabilities and people who identify as LGBTQIA+.

- **9** Remember in prayer all who despair, suffer or long for liberation, love and redemption.
- 10 Good Friday As we tell and retell the story of Jesus' life, suffering, death and resurrection, pray that we will see the cross as a vivid symbol and reminder of God's amazing love for us, a life-giving gift given to us in Jesus Christ that is meant to be shared through words, actions and imagery that inspire faith today.
- 11 The living word of God in Jesus Christ breaks through every barrier and border, shines light wherever there is darkness and bridges every rift and difference in humankind - real or imagined. Give praise and thanks to God!
- 12 *Easter Sunday* This is the day we eagerly anticipated, a day of celebration and joyous mystery the resurrection of Jesus Christ! Shout praise and glory to God for saving us and setting us free to live as children of God and share the good news with the world.
- 13 Give thanks for our church's long-standing commitment to global mission and faithful service alongside global companions, churches and organizations as they share the good news of Jesus Christ, care for neighbors in need, work for justice and grow the church.
- 14 Look up and all around today; notice what is good, life-giving and hope-inspiring. "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."
- 15 Give thanks for the volunteers of all ages who are vital to our mission and work in the world and who share their diverse gifts, interests and abilities in congregations, volunteer corps, camps and retreat centers, ELCA Global Mission, ELCA Mission Builders, Lutheran Disaster Response, Lutheran social ministry organizations and however else they feel called to serve.

16 Having received a new life and identity in Christ, we ask God to help us recognize and focus on what God considers to be important, good and true.

17 Remember in prayer ELCA missionaries serving alongside the Evangelical Church of the Augsburg Confession in the Slovak Republic in ministries of education, leadership development and parish life.

18 Give thanks for our church's history of hospitality and concern for refugees and immigrants. Pray for the 60 million displaced people in the world and ask God to equip and embolden us to advocate on their behalf and welcome them, in partnership with Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, the Lutheran World Federation and companion churches in other countries.

19 Earth Day Sunday Praise God for this wondrous creation! Give thanks for how our church embraces our responsibility to care for God's creation through stewardship, education, advocacy and urging one another to take personal and institutional responsibility. Pray that the partnerships and collaborations of the ELCA will produce far-reaching results through ecoAmerica's Blessed Tomorrow program, Creation Justice Ministries, Lutherans Restoring Creation and other networks focused on engaging the church and society in the care and stewardship of creation.

20 Ask for God's grace and forgiveness when questions and doubts undermine our joy in the good news of Jesus Christ. Give thanks that God meets our uncertainty with the same patience and love shown to the disciple Thomas when he needed reassurance that Jesus was the Son of God, the true Messiah and Savior of the world.



- 25 Give thanks that God is our ever-present refuge, counsel, comfort and joy.
- 26 Pray that we will recognize the presence of Jesus in our daily lives at home, at work, at church, in relationships, during leisure time and in our travels and encounters with strangers.
- 27 Give thanks for the witness and work of Alberto (Gustavo) Driau, regional representative for Argentina and Uruguay; Rachel Ringlaben, YAGM country coordinator; and the seven volunteers serving alongside our companions in Argentina and Uruguay as part of the Young Adults in Global Mission program.
- 28 Ask God to stir our generosity for supporting the ministries and witness of our congregations, synods and churchwide organization.
- **29** Pray that we will find words to share our faith in Jesus Christ and our understanding of Scripture with one another and the world, while also trusting that the Holy Spirit works to deepen our faith and enrich our knowledge of God's word and ways.
