Dear St. Andrew family of faith,

One of our practices as Christians of the Lutheran variety is an affirmation of infant baptism. Although many of our sister traditions practice believer’s baptism—the individual/s being baptized must be able to confess their belief in God—Martin Luther took a different route in his writings and teachings. Overwhelmed by God’s grace in baptism, Luther steadfastly maintained that “there is no greater comfort on earth than baptism”.

It is in baptism that we share in Christ’s death and resurrection, and it is where we are justified by grace through faith alone. This is why we invite families with infants and small children to the baptismal font—God’s gracious and saving act towards humanity is made clearest in the sacraments, and infants and children make it clear that salvation in Christ is first and foremost God’s gracious act that justifies us sinners.

You may recall from your own catechism that our tradition celebrates two sacraments: baptism, and communion.

Our congregation has a long history of beginning First Communion education when a child has reached 5th grade. This is a common practice in many Protestant churches! However, it is just that—a practice.

So, this year, I am working to expand the ways in which we invite all people to worship, including our youngest children.

As ELCA Lutherans, we affirm in our sacramental theology that the sacraments are where the elements (bread, water, wine/juice) meet the promises of God. Those crackers that we offer the kids in lieu of the bread or wafer are consecrated in the same way that the bread or wafers are consecrated. We just don’t say that we’re already offering the kids communion because we have been taught that they have

Greetings and continued blessings to all!!

It is hard to believe that another month is now behind us - spring, warmer weather and Mother's Day will soon be here! Mother's Day is a time to honor our mothers and share the day with them, talk to them on the phone or to maybe video "chat" or to remember their love and think of fond memories from the time they were with us. As has become tradition at St. Andrew, it is also the day when we can view the beautiful quilts put together by our quilting ministry and celebrate the talents of these hard workers. The group continues to meet each Thursday from 9-12 and the fourth Saturday of each month. As of April 15th, 254 quilts were completed this year and WE WILL reach or exceed our goal of 300 by Mother's Day! They will then be boxed to ship to Lutheran World Relief to help ease the pain and misery of people caught in natural disasters or war, those in refugee camps, in hospitals and in areas of unbelievable poverty. There is an increasing need and call for these LWR quilts!

The ultimate purpose of a homemade quilt is to provide warmth, an essential need for people in every climate. In addition to being a cozy clean new bed cover, it can be: a baby carrier tied around a mothers back, a market display spread on the ground and piled with vegetables, a sack for transporting those goods to market, a sunshade, a shawl and, most importantly, a constant reminder that someone far away cares a lot! LWR's mission is: Affirming God's love for all people. They work with Lutherans and partners around the world to end poverty, injustice and human suffering.

Your St. Andrew Quilters will also have an auction starting on Mother's Day that will be "open" for two weeks for some lucky winner to take home one of these quilts to keep for themselves or use as an awesome gift of love and warmth. Thanks be to our God over and over for this opportunity to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ! to understand communion in order for them to be allowed to take it—and then that teaching is regularly reinforced.

In “The Use of the Means of Grace”, an ELCA *Statement on the Practice of Word and Sacrament*, a variety of communion practices are outlined and affirmed, including communing young children.

In both the waters of baptism and the food of the Table, God nourishes our faith, forgives our sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the gospel. We do not participate out of our own goodness, righteousness, or holiness, but because the eucharist is a gift from Christ living in his church.

On May 15 at the 10:45 service, those children who have spent the last few weeks learning about communion and spending time in fellowship with one another will celebrate the eucharist with their whole family of faith. I hope you will join me in praising and thanking God as we witness the beauty of his table, and a foretaste of the kingdom to come.

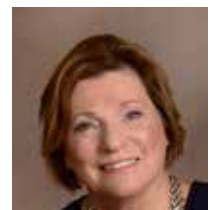

Updated Covid Safety Policy:

Updated Covid Safety Policy: Our church Council has approved a protocol for Covid safety. The current Lake County positivity is 3% and 17.2 cases per 100,000; so masks are optional for all church events. St. Andrew Covid Protocol:

- To follow the State and IDPH guidelines for safety recommendations
- Should the Covid infection rate for Lake County reach 10% positivity, to reinstate masking while indoors
- Should the Covid infection rate for Lake County reach 20% positivity, to move church events to a temporarily virtual format

STEWARDSHIP — OUR WAY OF LIFE HERE AT ST ANDREW

- A Community filled with LOVE & HOPE - “FULL TO THE BRIM”

Our mission as a congregation is to “Share Christ”...More specifically, it is to help people come to KNOW Christ, to GROW in their relationship with Christ and his church, and to be equipped to SERVE and WITNESS in Christ’s name. I’ve been encouraging you to think about our St. Andrew mission statement - the “how” and the “why” behind our plan of “Sharing Christ”. We were to consider the “KNOW” This may have had us thinking about ourselves and our values. Would others know that I follow Jesus if they were to spend time with me today? Did I extend Christ’s kindness today? I asked you then to consider how you may “GROW” in your faith and your love of God. Did you seek ways to grow spiritually? Did you obey the teachings of Jesus? How have you been living these measures so far? As we just passed through the season of Lent and Easter, Jesus’ suffering for our sins and his glorious resurrection to be with us always, our cups should not only be “filled to the brim” but OVERFLOWING with much to share!

Thus we move on to the next point - SERVE
“For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them” . Ephesians 2:10
“For I know the plans I have for you,“ declares the Lord, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” Jeremiah 29:11
“From the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.” Ephesians 4:16

Stewardship is taking care of what God has given us including our very lives, our talents (even when we think we have none or wonder what we have to share), our time (even when we feel it is not a good time or the right time to share our precious time with others); it is our responsibility also to serve others (love one another). These things are our response/our responsibilities to God for him allowing us to be here on this earth. We must grow courageous in our love to SERVE. Consider these questions: Did I see every person as a child of God today? Did I make someone’s life better today or at least try to do so? Was Christ, not just myself, my priority as I used my time, talents and treasures today? We may be surprised at times when we don’t think something we have done matters, but God is with us and will continue to guide us in the right time! We also will reap many benefits by following Jesus’ teachings and following our hearts!

I’ll share another story with you today (honestly I had a very difficult time picking just one!) - written by Jerusha Agen and published in the 2022 Daily Guideposts devotional:

“The woman poured out her story in bits and pieces, each sliver more terrible to hear than the last. I sat across from her at a Bible study I lead for inmates at the county jail. Yet in that moment, I didn’t feel like an adequate leader. I was stunned in the face of a nightmare she’d lived through as a child. During my time of service at the jail, I’d heard many tales of woe, but never had I met someone who had been through such horrific trauma. What could I say? Why in the world did the Lord send me to help this woman? I’m not a psychologist or social worker. I’m not a brilliant theologian.

Yet, I opened my mouth and words came out. True words about God’s role in suffering. About the comfort we have in His sovereignty, justice and grace.

Believing these truths, the student lit with a tearful smile as she embraced the hope set before her.

Often when I set out to teach this Bible study, feelings of inadequacy overwhelm me. Honestly, for many things in my life, I feel unequipped, unskilled, or simply not good enough.

But then God gently reminds me I am His workmanship, I am equipped for the good works He calls me to do because He created me for them and them for me. All I have to do is walk with God through each day, confident He will provide all I need to accomplish His work.”

Lord, help me to remember You chose and equipped me for the task at hand, not because of anything good in me, but because of everything good in You. Amen.

- 9 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assembly of the Rocky Mountain Synod, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders, proclaim the gospel, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world.
- 10 Remember in prayer students at college, university and seminary as they prepare for final exams, celebrate graduation or begin their careers, that they might find opportunities to use their gifts, faith and passion in service to their neighbors and communities.
- 11 “The Lord is my shepherd” (Psalm 23:1). Pray that we might find clarity and be reassured of God's love and attention through the psalmist's description of a shepherd who restores, leads, nourishes and accompanies us, calming our fears and showing us mercy.
- 12 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assemblies of the Delaware-Maryland Synod, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders, proclaim the gospel, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world.
- 13 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assemblies of the Oregon

Synod, the Saint Paul Area Synod, the Northeastern Ohio Synod and the East Central Synod of Wisconsin, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders, proclaim the gospel, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world.

14 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assemblies of the Northern Great Lakes, Southeast Michigan and North/West Lower Michigan synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders, proclaim the gospel, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world.

15 Pray that we will be faithful to Jesus' commandment to love one another, and pray that we might be recognized as disciples of Christ and communities of faith through our Spirit-inspired acts of love, kindness, service, justice and hospitality.

16 Remember in prayer the conflict in Ethiopia, which has caused displacement, suffering and loss of life among the most vulnerable — women, children and older adults. Pray for relief, hope and strength for those who have been impacted and for an end to the violence and ethnic discrimination. Give thanks for the relief work of Lutheran World Relief and the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, and for the financial support of Lutheran Disaster Response.

17 Ask the Spirit to stir our enthusiasm for sharing the good news of Jesus Christ throughout the world, that all people might know the boundless love of God that renews and unites us as siblings in Christ.

18 Pray that we might not grow weary or apathetic about the needs of our neighbor, especially when their difficulties and situations seem complicated, overwhelming or distant from us. Ask the Spirit to nurture within us love and concern that are enduring, impartial and wise.

19 Praise God for everything that brings joy, hope, encouragement or brightness into our lives.

20 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assemblies of the Pacifica,

Greater Milwaukee, Southeastern Iowa and Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders, proclaim the gospel, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world.

21 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assembly of the Northwestern Minnesota Synod, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders, proclaim the gospel, serve our neighbor and do God's work in the world.

22 Promise to respond to those we encounter who are struggling, homeless, lonely, grieving or ill; ask the Spirit to encourage, equip and guide us when we feel ill-equipped to love and care for our neighbor.

23 Thank God for our special relationship with The Episcopal Church, a full communion partner with the ELCA since 1999. Pray for the church, its members and its leaders, that together we will find strength and resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor, especially in these challenging times.

24 Among your siblings in Christ, who has surprised you with their welcoming spirit, generosity, wisdom or eagerness to share their faith? Give thanks to God for people who unexpectedly enrich our lives.

25 Give thanks for young adults from across the country who have responded to the call to serve in summer ministries at ELCA camps. Ask the Spirit to equip, inspire and sustain them for sharing their faith in Christ and developing caring communities of faith with campers of all backgrounds, abilities and ages.

26 *Ascension Day* "Clap your hands, all you peoples; shout to God with loud songs of joy. For the Lord, the Most High, is awesome, a great king over all the earth" (Psalm 47:1-2). Praise and honor our wonderful God!

27 “The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you” (John 14:26). Remember in prayer the gift of the Spirit in our midst, working through us to call, gather, enlighten, bless and unify the church on earth.

28 Pray for the ELCA Justice for Women program and its work fostering gender awareness, justice and dignity, that our congregations and communities might value, embrace and be shaped by the unique voices and experiences of people across race, ethnicity, ability, class, sexuality and age.

29 Ask God to unite us as communities of faith and siblings in Christ, introducing others to what God has done in the world through the life, teachings, suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus.

30 *Memorial Day* Remember, honor and give thanks for members of the armed forces who sacrificed their lives for the sake of peace. Pray for those who serve in harm’s way today and for our neighbors around the world who have served their own countries in pursuit of peace, justice and freedom.
