¹ When Pentecost Day arrived, they were all together in one place. ²Suddenly a sound from heaven like the howling of a fierce wind filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³They saw what



seemed to be individual flames of fire alighting on each one of them. ⁴They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them to speak. ~Act 2:1-4 CEB

On that day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit of God arrived just as Jesus had promised. In our baptisms, God breathes the Spirit onto us as we recall that first permanent indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

This is one of the reasons that I love celebrating Affirmation of Baptism Sunday on the same day as we celebrate Pentecost.

Students have spent the last 3 years intentionally preparing to say "yes" to their baptismal vows and to take on the promises their parents made on their behalf all those years ago. The same Spirit that God sent over them on the day of their baptisms is the same Spirit that swept over those who had gathered in Jerusalem for the Jewish Festival of Pentecost and, and it's the same Spirit that we carry with us in our own lives each and every day.

As a tradition that affirms infant baptism, we acknowledge that the time comes for each kid to take on the promises made on their behalf. In our church—like many other Lutheran churches—we shift gears from Sunday school to Confirmation Class when kids are in 6th or 7th grade.

'What should I do?', my daughter asked.

I put my arms around her. 'Exactly what the captain said. Also, put your fingers in your ears.'

'Will that help me feel better?'
'Trust me.'

She did-just in time to block out the inevitable and horrible sounds coming from the bunch inside.

Are you like me? Ridden a squall or two in this life? And we know what to do-listen to the Captain. It's easy for me to shake my head at clueless tourists who didn't listen to the captain, yet how many times have I ignored my Captain's voice and found myself miserable and suffering on some self-imposed bunk?

My daughter made it back to port in fine shape. As for me, I came away with a nice, heavenly reminder. I'll be keeping my face to the wind and my eyes on the horizon. And if I put my fingers in my ears, it'll only be after the Captain speaks."

At evening to myself I say,

My soul, where hast thou glean'd to-day, Thy labours how bestow'd? What hast thou rightly said or done? What grace attain'd, or knowledge won,

I wasn't raised in the Lutheran church, nor was I baptized as an infant, so I never had to go through Confirmation. I remember being fascinated with the stories my college classmates shared about the trials and tribulations of their Confirmation classes. Many of them had awful experiences. The materials were dull, the pastor or lay leader didn't seem all that interested in being there, and it felt an awful lot like school but without some of the fun social aspects.

My goal, as the one who prepares and teaches our Confirmation classes, has always been to give our kids something to hold onto when life is hard. To help them learn more about why the church does what it does and why it actually **does** matter for their lives. Above all, I stress again and again that God loves them. Our tradition teaches us that we have been saved by grace through faith apart from works—we can do nothing to earn God's love and we can do nothing to lose God's love. In a world that teaches us the exact opposite, we learn just how wild and not boring God's ways are.

I really hope you will be with us on May 28 when our 3 Confirmands affirm their baptisms. I hope that you will see them not as the future of our church, but as the present of our church. I hope that you will continue to encourage them, pray for them, and get to know them as your sisters and brothers in Christ. I hope that you can bear witness to the Spirit working in them and through them, even when the language they speak seems strange or incomprehensible.

In all of these things, we ask the Lord to help and guide us as we say, "Yes Lord!"




